We strive to offer more tennis action, great matches and lots of fun! See you around the courts in September!

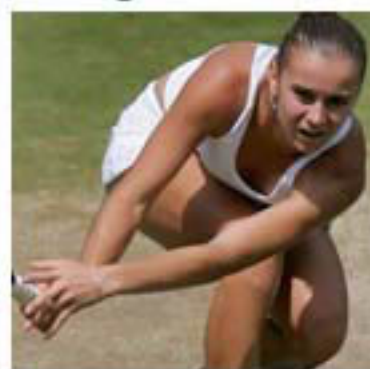
Did you know – Kuta Karnival Parade



Wismilak International[®] Bali participates in the biggest cultural event in Bali, Kuta Karnival 2005! Approximately 20 children from the local tennis school will join the Kuta Karnival Parade on July 3rd and circle the route around Kuta Beach, from Papa's Café to Melasti, Legian through Ground Zero where they will stop for a minute of silence, then onwards ending in front of Bali Anggrek Hotel, along the Kuta beach stretch. The parade is flagged off at 15.00 hrs and will take about three hours to complete the route, watched by approximately fifty thousand spectators

by the road sides, at one of the busiest parts of the island of Bali. The children will be introducing Wismilak International[®] Bali inviting spectators to partake in this international event, carrying banners and handing out flyers of information to the crowd.
