

**RESULTS FROM THE \$225,000 WISMILAK INTERNATIONAL WTA EVENT  
HELD IN BALI, INDONESIA**

**1st round**

Francesca Schiavone faced an embarrassing defeat at the hands of little-known American Jamea Jackson at the Wismilak International on Monday, but the fourth seeded Italian survived a battle lasting almost two and a half hours to win 6-4, 3-6, 6-4.

Part of the blame for Schiavone's struggle could be blamed on her nightmare journey from the US Open. Her direct flight from New York to Singapore was diverted to London when a passenger was taken sick. Next, the plane developed a technical fault and was forced to stop in Bangkok for five hours. Then a weary Schiavone had to wait four hours to connect from Singapore to Bali.

"I was tired because it took me 40 hours to get here from New York," said Schiavone. "But she is good. It was tough. It was the first time that I saw her and I just tried to do my job. It wasn't great. I had to run and to fight. She fought all the match."

Just one break separated the pair in the opening set, which Schiavone claimed with a dropshot on break point at 5-4. But Jackson then used her powerful groundstrokes to take control of the second set, breaking Schiavone three times.

In the final set, the Italian seemed to have the match under control when she led 5-1, but Jackson refused to concede and rallied and twice held break point to level the set at 5-5. A relieved Schiavone eventually won on her fifth match point.

The only other seed in action on the opening day advanced with ease, as seventh seeded Na Li of China dominated Spain's Nuria Llagostera Vives to win 6-3, 6-1.

Italy's Maria Elena Camerin, like Schiavone, also struggled but emerged from a three-set battle with a 6-2, 3-6, 6-4 victory over Marta Domachowska of Poland. Ukraine's Alona Bondarenko overcame Yoon Jeong Cho 6-4, 6-4, and Rika Fujiwara set up a meeting with Lindsay Davenport by ousting Natalie Grandin of South Africa 6-4, 2-6, 7-6 (7-5).

Four players came through the qualifying rounds on Monday, with Zi Yan and Tian Tian Sun of China, Tomoko Yonemura of Japan and Germany's Martina Muller reaching the main draw. **(Barry Wood)**
